Wonderful World of Wind, Waves & Water

ages 10-15 Discover the connections between sailing and the sciences, from the wind above to the water below. Mornings in the boathouse, on the beach & on our new research vessel.

Fins, Whiskers & Claws: The Lives & Haunts of Pleasant Bay Marine Animals

ages 11-15 Join marine scientists to explore diversity of wildlife and habitats aboard our new research vessel.

The Art & Joy of Fly Fishing

ages 11-17 Learn about fish ecology, tying flies, the art of the cast, and thrill of the catch on and off the Bay. 1 or 2 weeks.

SPECIAL EVENTS

Shark Bites ages 21+ Cruise the Bay with Shark Conservancy scientists on our research vessel to get the update on great whites by collecting data from a receiver buoy. Finish with the ins & outs of anatomy while dissecting a spiny dogfish shark back at the boathouse.

An Aquaculture Excursion ages 10 and up

Hands-on introduction to shellfish aquaculture aboard our new research vessel followed by tasty oysters on shore.

ADAPTIVE PROGRAMS

Blind & Vision-Impaired Sailing (BVI)

Ambulatory veterans learn to sail on Pleasant Bay while building teamwork and comradery.

Special Olympics/Cape Abilities Sailing

Sailing instruction, activities and competition offered to youth and adults with cognitive disabilities.

SPECIAL PROGRAMS

First Sail Third graders from local schools learn the science of sailing at the end of the school year.

Monomoy Community Services Sailing

Children of local working families enjoy exposure to boating at PBCB.

Town Recreation Programs Boating programs for area children are coordinated through local recreation departments.

Town Elder Services Programs Boating programs for elders are offered through the Councils on Aging of Chatham, Harwich, Orleans, and Brewster.
