A BRIEF HISTORY

In 2003, PBCB began operating out of a pick-up truck on a Pleasant Bay public beach. In 2014, we acquired waterfront property on the Bay that includes a dock, a boathouse, four buildings, and 750 feet of beach frontage.

PBCB is a nonprofit organization that provides affordable, quality sailing and boating, marine education, and environmental stewardship opportunities for all community members – regardless of financial, physical, developmental or cognitive abilities.

Students will be grouped by ability at the beginning of each class.

Sailing for Veterans: it's technical, requires teamwork, and invigorates! Join a group of veterans of wars from Vietnam to Afghanistan who sail together on Pleasant Bay. 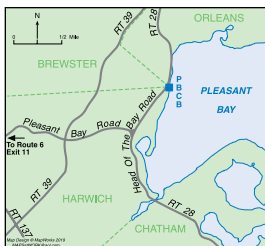
